






The Centre and Location

Transportation

How to reach BCAM from the airport

- By Public Bus: **Bizkaibus.** Its color is Green, Bus number A3247. A one-way ticket costs 3.00 euros. Every 30 minutes from 6:15 to 00:00.

Stops in Bilbao:

Alameda Recalde 14 (this bus stop is 2 minute's walk to BCAM) - Plaza Moyua - Gran Vía 47 - Termibus (Main Bus Station)

- By Taxi:

There is a taxi stop at "Arrivals". It costs approx. 25 Euro



How to reach BCAM from the train station

You can walk from the train Station to BCAM because it is 10 minute's walk but if you prefer, you can take a taxi that will cost approx. 6 euros.

How to reach BCAM from the main bus station "Termibus"

-By Metro (Underground).

There is a "metro-stop" at Termibus.

Steps:

- 1. Buy a ticket: 1.50 euros.
- 2.Metro direction: Etxebarri-Basauri
- 3. Get off at "Abando Station"
- 4.8-minute walk to reach BCAM
- By Tram.

Tram-Station at Termibus

Steps:

- 1. Buy a ticket, for 1.50 euros.
- 2. Take the tram direction "Atxuri"
- 3. Get off at "Uribitarte Station"
- 4.3-minute walk to reach BCAM

How to reach BCAM by car

Address: BCAM Alameda Mazarredo no.14 – Bilbao *restrictions to park the car*

Closest public parking: Pio Baroja Square. 2.90 euro per hour – additional hour 2.35 euro – 24 hours 18.10 euro.

Special Transport Card "Barik"

This card is valid for every transport in Bilbao and in the province of Biscay means of transport in Bizkaia called "BARIK". The cost of the trip will be cheaper.

You can get this Barik card in the automatic ticket machines in every Metro station, in Renfe, in the green cabins of Bilbobus and Bizkaibus, and in many commercial premises.

This card costs 3 euros and you should recharge it (minimum 5 euros).




Map

Health

Bilbao has an extensive healthcare network that meets the needs of citizens through the Basque Health Service – Osakidetza http://www.osakidetza.euskadi.eus/Foreign people are provided with basic healthcare coverage through the interaction of national health systems or through health insurance.

EUROPEAN CITIZENS

- European citizens (Lichtenstein, Iceland, Norway, and Switzerland inclusive)should obtain the European Health Insurance Card before coming to BCAM
- European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) is valid for two years until the expiry date is shown. Use of the EHIC during its validity period is subject to the holder continuing to meet the requirements under which the card was issued. Nevertheless, expenses incurred may be recovered as undue benefits, pursuant to the provisions of article 76 of Regulation (EC) 883/04.
- It is important that you ensure that you have an EHIC and that its validity period includes the planned return date before traveling to another country in the European Economic Area (1) or Switzerland. If not, request a new EHIC to guarantee your healthcare cover during your stay. (1) States in which the EHC is valid: Germany, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Slovakia, Slovenia, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta,

NON-EUROPEAN CITIZENS

- Some non-EU Countries have signed Bilateral Agreements about the Social Security Healthcare although it is **highly desirable you contract Private Health**Insurance before coming to BCAM

CLIMATE

Bilbao has a humid oceanic climate, with predominantly West winds, that make temperatures milder and favor temperate weather throughout the year. Given its proximity to the sea, the climate is mild and without extreme temperature changes between the seasons: with an average temperature of 8°C in winter and 20°C in summer. Throughout the whole year, it can be very rainy. Forecast: http://www.eltiempo.es (Bilbao, Vizcaya)

LANGUAGE

In the same way, as in the rest of the Basque Country, Bilbao has two official languages: Spanish and Basque. Both are used interchangeably in the administration and in the public services and increasingly more in everyday life. Many people, mainly young people, are fluent in English.

CURRENCY

The official currency in Bilbao is the Euro.

The majority of retail establishments accept credit cards and will ask the customer to show proof of identity. However, it is also easy to get cash from the ATM at the many bank branches around the city.

VISA

A visa is not obligatory to enter Bilbao, although it might be needed depending on the place of origin. Citizens of the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland only require a passport or identity document and minors, in addition, need parental permission.

Moreover, for stays of less than three months, a visa is not needed by people traveling from Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Bolivia, Brazil, Brunei, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Croatia, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Holy See, Honduras, Israel, Japan, Liechtenstein, Malaysia, Mexico, Monaco, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Romania, San Marino, Singapore, South Korea, Uruguay, USA, Venezuela and special administrative regions of Macao and Hong Kong in the People's Republic of China.

There are several types of visa depending on the purpose of the visit: transit, stay, residence, work, and study. This document should be requested at the Spanish Consulates or Embassies in the country of origin. The cost of the procedure varies depending on the type of visa, the number of visits or the place where it should be dealt with.

In BCAM, we give you more detailed information about this point. Each situation is different.

Shopping & Gastronomy

SHOPPING (summary)

Shops most frequently open between 9.00 and 10.00 a.m. and close between 1.30 and 2.00 p.m., and then open again after lunch between 4.00 and 5.00 p.m. and close between 7.30 and 8.00 p.m., inclusive Supermarkets.

The city's shopping centers are the exception to these opening hours as they open continuously from 9.30 a.m. to 9.00 or 10.00 p.m. as:

ZUBIARTE at Leizaola Lehendakaria street 2 – Bilbao

EL CORTE INGLES at Gran Vía, 7-9, also at Gran Vía 20 and at Ercilla street 24 in Bilbao

DECATHLON SPORT at Villarías Street in Bilbao

FORUM SPORT at Campuzano Square in Bilbao

Most of the shops close on Sundays and public holidays and on Saturday afternoons during the summer months.

OPENCOR BILBAO at Alameda Recalde street 29, in Bilbao, opens every day from 7:00 to 1:00, Monday to Sunday. Here, you can find different products as well as food & drinks.

GASTRONOMY (summary)

Pintxos: The Basque Country has its own unique food culture that revolves around the bar. Pintxos (bite-sized appetizers, similar to tapas) can be found in nearly every bar. Often the bar counter will be filled with plates of all different varieties. They range from being rather traditional to very experimental in nature. It is typical to find the locals out enjoying a drink such as Txakoli, Rioja Wine, or a zurito (small beer) while sampling different pintxos and then going on to the next bar to do the same thing all over. This is sometimes done before a meal as a kind of aperitif or it can take the place of a normal meal.

Restaurants: The range of prices is huge. You can eat a daily, 12 euro menu or you can enjoy it in a restaurant with Michelin Stars like Zortziko, Nerua, Etxanobe, or Asian.

Close to BCAM you can find these good restaurants: Restaurant Larruz, Restaurant Atea, Nicolas, Mugarra, Las Cepas, Pizarra, Bistró Guggenheim...
